## Keynote Speakers



**David L. Bell, MD, MPH** is an Associate Professor in the Department of Pediatrics (College of Physicians & Surgeons) and in the Heilbrunn Department of Population and Family Health (Mailman School of Public Health) at Columbia University Medical Center. Dr. Bell is the Medical Director of the Family Planning Program that includes the Young Men's Clinic, a unique adjunct to New York Presbyterian Hospital's Family Planning Clinic. Since 1999, Dr. Bell has been Medical Director of the Young Men's Clinic. In that capacity, he delivers primary care to adolescent and young adult males and is a strong advocate for the right of young men to have access to high quality and respectful services that address the issues relevant to adolescent and young men, which includes attention to their sexual and reproductive health.

**Dr. Brent Davidson** is the Vice Chair of Women's Health Services at Henry Ford Health System. In addition to being the Physician in Charge of Henry Ford West Bloomfield's ambulatory clinics, he is also the Medical Director for Family Planning for the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and serves on the Board of Directors for HAVEN, Oakland County's domestic violence shelter.

He attended medical school at the University of Louisville, completed his residency in Ob/Gyn at the University of Michigan, and joined the Henry Ford Medical Group in 1985 as Senior Staff at Henry Ford Medical Center - West Bloomfield. He was appointed Division Head for the Oakland region and developed and integrated it into the Division of Women's Health at Henry Ford West Bloomfield Hospital in 2009. He served as Service Chief for Women's Health Services at the hospital until 2016.

### **303: Using Technology to Identify Risks, Support Safer Sex Behaviors, and Showcase Outcomes!**

The Rapid Assessment for Adolescent Preventive Services (RAAPS) are technology based, validated risk assessments developed to support professionals in addressing the risk behaviors impacting health, well-being, and academic success in youth. The ACT-Sexual Health modules work like a virtual health educator - supporting your clinical care by using technology to gather a comprehensive sexual health history, guide youth towards developing a safer sex action plan, and provide a visit report. Information on RAAPS and ACT will be shared along with sexual health data from clinics across the U.S. Additionally, this presentation will use a case-based approach sharing the experiences of Berrien County Health Department in implementing the RAAPS and ACT program in their sexual health clinic since August 2016. An overview of RAAPS and ACT clinic flow-initial and follow up visits, case studies, costs/funding, and risk data will be discussed.

The once dark lines of separation between sectors are blurring and the theory of intersectionality is becoming more widely understood by service providers and professionals. Reproductive Justice is a powerful movement that is helping to change the discourse on healthcare in this country as well as shift power dynamics within systems that have failed to honor the expertise and experiences of people of color. Reproductive Justice as a framework offers innovative strategies and solutions to achieving health equity by naming and defining reproductive oppression and centering the most marginalized. By seeking every opportunity to shift culture and with a focus on systematic change, Reproductive Justice as a movement and framework is imperative to transform healthcare so that it is both equitable and just.
