

## HIV & Sex Education Compliance Check List

Michigan School Code has specific mandates for HIV and Sex Education. Below is a quick checklist of all of the mandates.

	<b>HIV – Mandatory for all Michigan Public Schools</b>
	Instructional materials and methods have been approved by the school board
	Instruction is provided at every building level
	Instruction to students stresses abstinence
	Teachers providing the HIV/AIDS instruction have had training within the last 5 years
	Parents are notified prior to instruction.
	<b>Sex Education – Optional for all Michigan Public Schools</b>
	Sex Education Supervisor has been selected and name is on file with Michigan Department of Education
	<b>Sex Education Advisory Board (SEAB)</b>
	Sex Education Advisory Board (SEAB) has been established
	Two Co-Chairs have been appointed to SEAB one of whom is a parent of a child attending a school operated by the district.
	SEAB membership includes parents, students, educators, local clergy and community health professional
	At least half of the members of the SEAB are parents who have a child attending a school operated by the school district.
	A majority of the parents on the SEAB are not employed by a school district
	SEAB has established program goals and objectives for pupil knowledge and skills
	SEAB members are given two weeks written or electronic notice of meetings.
	SEAB has reviewed and recommended materials and methods for instruction to the school board for approval for all students (general education, special education, alternative education).
	SEAB recommendation of materials and methods has gone through two public hearings and school board approval.
	After instruction has taken place, SEAB has evaluated, measured and reported to the parents of the district the attainment of program goals and objectives at least once every two years.
	<b>Sex Education Curricula &amp; Instruction</b>
	Teachers providing reproductive health/sex education are qualified to teach health and have received HIV/AIDS training within the last 5 years
	The Sex Education materials and methods stress abstinence
	The Sex Education materials and methods are age-appropriate
	The Sex Education materials and methods are medically accurate
	The Sex Education materials and methods contain the eleven required content areas identified in the Michigan School Code as (a) – (k).
	The prohibited content is not a part of the sex education materials and methods
	Parent are notified prior to instruction
	At the secondary level, instructors must be qualified to teach health with an MA, MX or KH endorsement on their degree.
	Guest speakers providing instruction must have a “qualified” teacher in the classroom.
